## Psalm 91 - Part 2

### How to Use This Guide

This self-study guide is a companion document to the video course "Prayer for Protection - Psalm 9, Part 2"

4. **Life Application** - God calls for us to not just be a hearer of His word, but a doer also. (James 1:22). This means that God expects for us to apply what we learn about Him in our everyday lives. This section of the study is to help you think about the ways to apply what you learn from the course to your everyday life.
5. **Memory Scriptures** - Scriptures that support key concepts in the course will be highlighted. We encourage you to memorize these scriptures by meditating on them until they are hidden in your heart. When you hide God's word in your heart, it makes it hard for the enemy to deceive you. In this way, you are less likely to sin against God. (Psalm 119:11)

### Introduction to Course Thirty-Four

In this course, we will look at Part 2 of a 2 Part series on Psalm 91 which is a Prayer for Protection. Examining this section we see that there is a dialogue happening in the entire Psalm and verses 14 - 16 introduces yet another Person to the conversation. While we don't know for sure, some have said that it is king David or perhaps Moses who wrote Psalm 91. Based on what we learnt last week I believe it is clear who penned this Psalm.

Prayer for Protection - Psalm 91, Part 2	
<b>Synopsis</b>	<p>Psalm 91:14-16 “Because he has set his love upon Me, therefore I will deliver him;I will set him on high, because he has known My name.  <sup>15</sup> He shall call upon Me, and I will answer him; I <i>will be</i> with him in trouble; I will deliver him and honor him. <sup>16</sup> With long life I will satisfy him,</p> <p>At the beginning of the Psalm we see that the author says that what brings God’s protection is abiding under His shadow. At the end of the Psalm in verses 14-16 we see that God says it is because we love Him and we know His name.</p>
<b>Key Vocabulary/ Concepts</b>	<p><b>Known - Strong’s Concordance 34045</b> <i>yada</i> to know.</p>
<b>Deeper Learning</b>	<p>The Hebrew word <i>yada</i> is a deeper level of knowing someone. It is the same word from Genesis 4:1 where it says Adam <i>knew</i> Eve. This refers to intimacy. Knowing someone at a deeper level.</p> <p>God says it is our intimate knowledge of Him and our love for Him that causes Him to protect us in our times of trouble. This means that this level of protection is reserved for those who truly seek to know Him fully and it is guaranteed that we have this level of protection from dangers seen and unseen.</p>
<b>Life Application</b>	<p>Let’s examine some of the activities we can engage in to know God better:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(1) Prayer - not just speaking but listening</li> <li>(2) Reading the Bible</li> <li>(3) Meditating on the Bible</li> <li>(4) Worship</li> <li>(5) Solitude</li> <li>(6) Obedience to God’s commands</li> </ol> <p>All of these are disciplines and require us to set time aside to do them. This is not something that gets done without us putting in some effort. How are you doing with these activities?</p>

	<p>If you think of the activities between a husband and a wife it looks similar. They spend time together alone, they go out together, they participate in activities together, they listen to each other, and they do things to make the other person happy.</p> <p>Based on Jeremiah 1:5, we see that God has an intimate knowledge of who we are individually and I believe He is just asking us to reciprocate.</p>
<p><b>Memory Scriptures</b></p>	<p>(Jeremiah 1:5) <i>“Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations.”</i></p>
