Introduction to Course Fifty Three

This is the continuation of Prophetic intercessor, also known as the Watchman.

We'll continue to look at the gifts that make up the calling or role of the Prophetic Intercessor or the Watchman.

The Prophetic Intercessor, The Watchman - Part 2	
Synopsis	<p>The Prophetic Intercessor, much like the teacher, pastor, prophet, evangelist and the apostle is a role in the body of Christ.</p> <p>You can view this as having a job at your place of employment. In order to do this job effectively you need to have spiritual gifts that support you in this role.</p> <p>Using the book of Ezekiel, you can clearly see the spiritual gifts that Ezekiel was able to access to fulfill this role:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Open and closed visions Traveling in the spirit with his physical body Intercession Prophecy Gift of Mercy Reading the minds of others Immediate results from spoken words Working of Miracles Word of Wisdom Word of Knowledge Discerning of spirits Receiving blueprints for restoration <p>Other things include working with angels and also living a symbolic lifestyle.</p> <p>I would highly recommend that you read the book of Ezekiel to see if you can identify other spiritual gifts</p>
Key Vocabulary/ Concepts	<p>Hebrew Strong's Concordance - 5012</p> <p>Naba: To prophesy, to speak or sing by inspiration</p> <p>Usage: The Hebrew verb "naba" primarily means to prophesy or to speak under divine inspiration. It is used to describe the act of delivering messages from God, often concerning future events or divine will. This term is associated with the role of prophets in the Old Testament, who</p>

	<p>were chosen by God to convey His words to the people of Israel. The act of prophesying could include foretelling future events, providing guidance, or delivering warnings and judgments.</p> <p>Cultural and Historical Background: In ancient Israel, prophets played a crucial role as intermediaries between God and His people. They were often called to speak during times of crisis or moral decline, urging the nation to return to covenant faithfulness. Prophets like Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Ezekiel were central figures in the religious and social life of Israel, and their messages were recorded as part of the Hebrew Scriptures. The act of prophesying was not limited to foretelling the future but included a wide range of divine communications, often delivered in poetic or symbolic language.</p>
<p>Deeper Learning</p>	<p>With an understanding that the prophetic intercessor sees things from a higher vantage point, you can now see why this person would sometimes appear “crazy” to the rest of the world.</p> <p>Imagine seeing things in a completely different way and trying to convey it to others who just cannot see it the way you do. Further, it is not that they don’t want to see it from the viewpoint of the prophetic intercessor but that they are just not physically able to see it especially when everything in the natural says otherwise.</p> <p>With this in mind, as the prophetic intercessor, being offended when others don’t see things the way you do is pointless. You should also never see this as others rejecting you because it is not you they reject but rather God Himself who delivers the message through you.</p> <p>One of the challenges as a prophetic intercessor is discerning the timing of things. When you are up on “the watchman’s tower” and you see things approaching, it is hard to determine the timeline in which things will happen in the natural. Any change in the people also affects the timeline. We know that in situations when it is the judgment of God that is coming, the people simply repenting will stop the judgement. The hope of all prophetic intercessors is that people will repent.</p> <p>According to Ezekiel 33, the job of the prophetic intercessor is to deliver the message so whether the judgement strikes and everyone can see that</p>

	<p>you were right, or they repent and nothing happens the most important thing is that you obeyed the Lord.</p>
<p>Life Application</p>	<p>With all these spiritual gifts available to fulfill this role there comes a great responsibility to use them wisely and to use it for the glory of God and for His purposes only and not for selfish gain.</p> <p>As such there are some personality traits and fleshly habits that would hinder how someone would function in this role.</p> <p>These would include, but are not limited to, anger, jealousy, envy, unforgiveness, bitterness, selfish ambition, fear, over sharing, pride and drunkenness just to name a few.</p> <p>These things could cloud the judgement of the prophetic intercessor and they could then potentially use the gifts for their own benefit instead of what the Word of God states as the purpose for all spiritual gifts...</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>Ephesians 4:12-14 AMP</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>[and He did this] to fully equip and perfect the saints (God's people) for works of service, to build up the body of Christ [the church]; until we all reach oneness in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God, [growing spiritually] to become a mature believer, reaching to the measure of the fullness of Christ [manifesting His spiritual completeness and exercising our spiritual gifts in unity]. So that we are no longer children [spiritually immature], tossed back and forth [like ships on a stormy sea] and carried about by every wind of [shifting] doctrine, by the cunning and trickery of [unscrupulous] men, by the deceitful scheming of people ready to do anything [for personal profit].</i></p> <p>Is there any area in your own life where you see that you have habits or behaviors that would hinder you from performing this role? Pray about it and consider going through deliverance or healing sessions to be free from these things.</p> <p>The final thing I would like to address is your personal outlook on life. In the role of the prophetic intercessor you will know a lot of the negative things about others and what is happening in the world. As a result, if by</p>

	<p>default you are a negative person this gift will make this trait in you even worse. The danger of this is most people will likely know that you are a negative person so when there is real danger and you try to warn them, they will not listen because they'll view it as you being your usual self, negative. It's like the boy who cried wolf one too many times until there really was a wolf.</p> <p>Consider this when you interact with others. Does your conversation always end negatively? Do you have a difficult time seeing the positive even in a bad situation? Are you combative and argumentative? This would be another area where you need to ask the Lord to help you speak more positively and spot the one diamond of hope in every situation.</p> <p>Even if you already have this reputation, you can change it! It is as simple as this, the next time you are getting ready to share something that is unpleasant or negative - even if it is true - ask yourself the question, is something serious and detrimental about to happen if I don't share this information with this person? If the answer is no, you do not need to share it. Pray about it and move on. Just remain quiet. People will start to notice that you are not as negative as you used to be.</p> <p>Remember, He is a God of restoration and redemption, so no matter how badly things may appear in the end everything will work out just fine.</p>
